2. What does your friend look like?

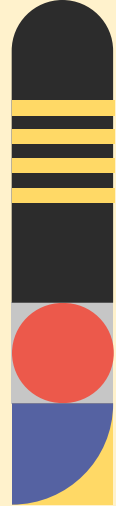
☞ Nam is a tall guy with a square face and big brown eyes. His smile can knock down any girl.

I adore her because she is such a kind-hearted, caring and loving person in the family.

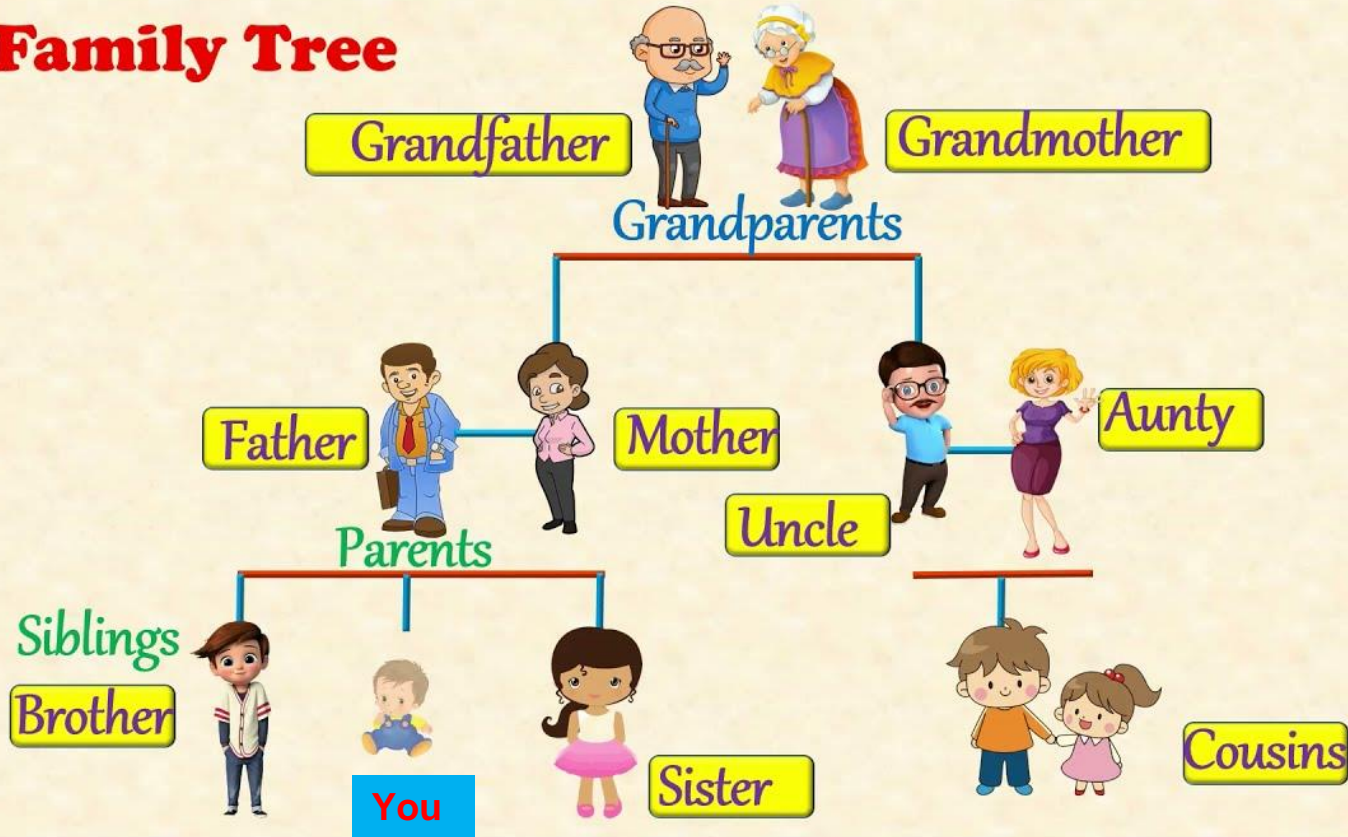
