PREDICTING



 Read the title, headings, pictures, etc. → to predict information in the text

- Read the questions > predict the answers
 - type of information (*E.g.: name, date, number, price, etc.*)
 - type of words (*E.g.: nouns, verb, adjective, etc.*)
 - synonyms/ paraphrasing (E.g.: 25% = a quarter)
 - → help to understand the audio
 - → identify the right information















LISTENING FOR MAIN IDEAS



- Main idea = gist, the most important idea the speaker is trying to say.
- Usually, the main idea will be at the start of the
- lecture/conversation/news/interview,..., followed by the supporting ideas.
- · Several main ideas can be presented in the speech, giving the general
 - Information or ideas.

Main idea is often repeated to emphasize the key point.



DETECTING THE MAIN IDEAS



- ✓ In order to listen for main ideas, you should highlight and listen carefully to the **key words**.
- ✓ Content words = information, meaning
- \therefore **Function words =** necessary words for grammar
 - 🗸 Auxiliary verb, Article, Prepositions, Conjunctions, Pronoun
 - Pay attention to the **PACE** (the **speed** of speech)



LISTENING FOR DETAILS



- Details = Facts, statements, examples,... → guide the listeners to a full understanding of the main idea
- They clarify, illuminate, explain, describe, or expand the main idea(s) of the speech.
- ∴ You don't need to understand the meaning of every word or the whole.
 listening text → ignore irrelevant information













MAKING INFERENCES

- Understand what the speakers are saying by inferring meaning, as the information is not always explicitly stated.
- Infer the speaker's attitude to what they are saying, their purpose and the reasons specific information that is mentioned.
- To infer meaning, you need to listen for clues in the text (e.g.: relationship between the speakers, tone of voice, word use, etc.) and use your general knowledge to guess the meaning of what the speakers
