

ELISION???



- The *disappearance* of a sound
- ➔ A phoneme may (be realized as zero/
have zero realization/ be deleted.)

ELISION:

- Typical of *rapid, casual* speech
 - ➡ Make tongue movement easier
 - ➡ Weaken our articulation

Examples

Loss of weak vowel (schwa):

□ After /p/, /t/, /k/

No elision Elision

potato / pə'teɪtəʊ / → / p'teɪtəʊ /

tomato / tə'ma:təʊ / → / t'ma:təʊ /

canary / kə'neəri / → / k'nəəri /

Loss of weak vowel (schwa):

❑ Before /n/, /l/, /r/

No elision

Elision

tonight /tə'naɪt/ → /t'naɪt/

police /pə'li:s/ → /p'li:s/

correct /kə'rekt/ → /k'rekt/

Avoidance of complex consonants clusters

- Syllable-final clusters involving /t/, /d/

Word/combination	No elision	Elision
asked	/a:skt/	/a:st/
desktop	/'dɛsk,tɒp/	/'dɛs,tɒp/
kept quiet	/,kɛpt'twaiət/	/,kɛp'twaiət/
at least twice	/ət li:st'twaɪs/	/ət li:s'twaɪs/
next to	/'nɛkst,tʊ/	/'nɛks,tʊ/
for the first time	/fə ðə,fɜ:st'taɪm/	/fə ðə,fɜ:s'taɪm/

The loss of final /v/ in “of” before consonants

- Lots of them → /lɒts ə ðəm/
- Waste of money → /weɪst ə 'mʌni /

The loss of /h/

- Tell (h)im → /tel ɪm/
- You shouldn't (h)ave

Contractions of grammatical words

	Contraction s	Pronounced
had/would	'd	/d/ or /əd/
is/has	's	/s/ or /z/ or /ɪz/
will	'll	/l/
have	've	/v/ or /əv/
are	're	/ə/
